If the Japanese Friendship Garden shall determine at the outset or at a later time that the need does not exist, or no longer exists, or for some reason it is not possible or prudent to administer my gift as originally intended, then the Japanese Friendship Garden may, in it’s sole and uncontrolled discretion, direct the use of my bequest for a purpose related as closely as possible to that stated above.”

Some examples of **particular purposes** may include but are not limited to, purchase trees and plants, Build Japanese style security exterior walls, Enlarge the gift shop, Tea house maintenance, Build a Japanese Snack bar, Construct a covered Viewing pavilion etc.

If you have named the Japanese Friendship Garden in your will or trust, please let us know so we can ensure that your gift is used according to your wishes. If you prefer to remain anonymous, we will keep your name and gift in confidence and with great appreciation.
